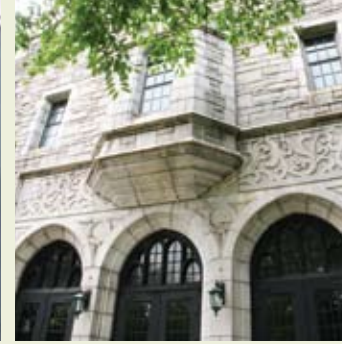


# Ewha Welcome Center Campus Guide

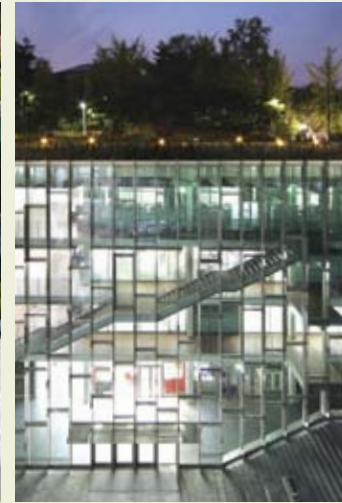
**Welcome Tours:** Offered year around from September 2013

# Top Six Campus Attractions



## Ewha Campus Complex (ECC)

ECC is Korea's largest underground campus structure, featuring environment-friendly technologies and a design resembling a glass-and-steel valley, and houses a range of educational, cultural, and administrative facilities.

**Note** Visitor access is limited to Gate 3 and Gate 4 on B4

## Ewha Womans University Museum (Centennial Museum)

The Ewha Womans University Museum offers a wide range of displays from cultural artifacts to contemporary art in its Permanent Exhibition Hall, Modern Art Gallery, Special Exhibition Hall, Donated Artifacts Exhibition Hall and Chang Budeok Memorial Gallery.

## Welch-Ryang Auditorium

Equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, this 2,800-seat auditorium was, at the time of its building, the largest concert hall in Asia staging the world's leading performers. Today the building serves as a venue for chapel services and for ceremonies in the Ewha community.

## Ewha Archives

The Ewha Archives building was designed as a replica of the traditional hanok house where Ewha Haktang first opened in 1886 and now serves as the venue for learning and experiencing the proud history of Ewha.

## Pfeiffer Hall (Main Hall)

Pfeiffer Hall was the first building constructed when the campus moved to Sinchon in 1935, and all courses took place inside this Gothic style hall prior to the Korean War. It now serves as the campus' main administration building where the office of the president is located. This historic building was designated by the government as a Registered Cultural Asset.

## Natural History Museum

Opened in 1969 as the first of its kind in Korea, the Ewha Natural History Museum provides learning opportunities through its extensive specimen displays, dioramas, ecology center and special exhibitions.

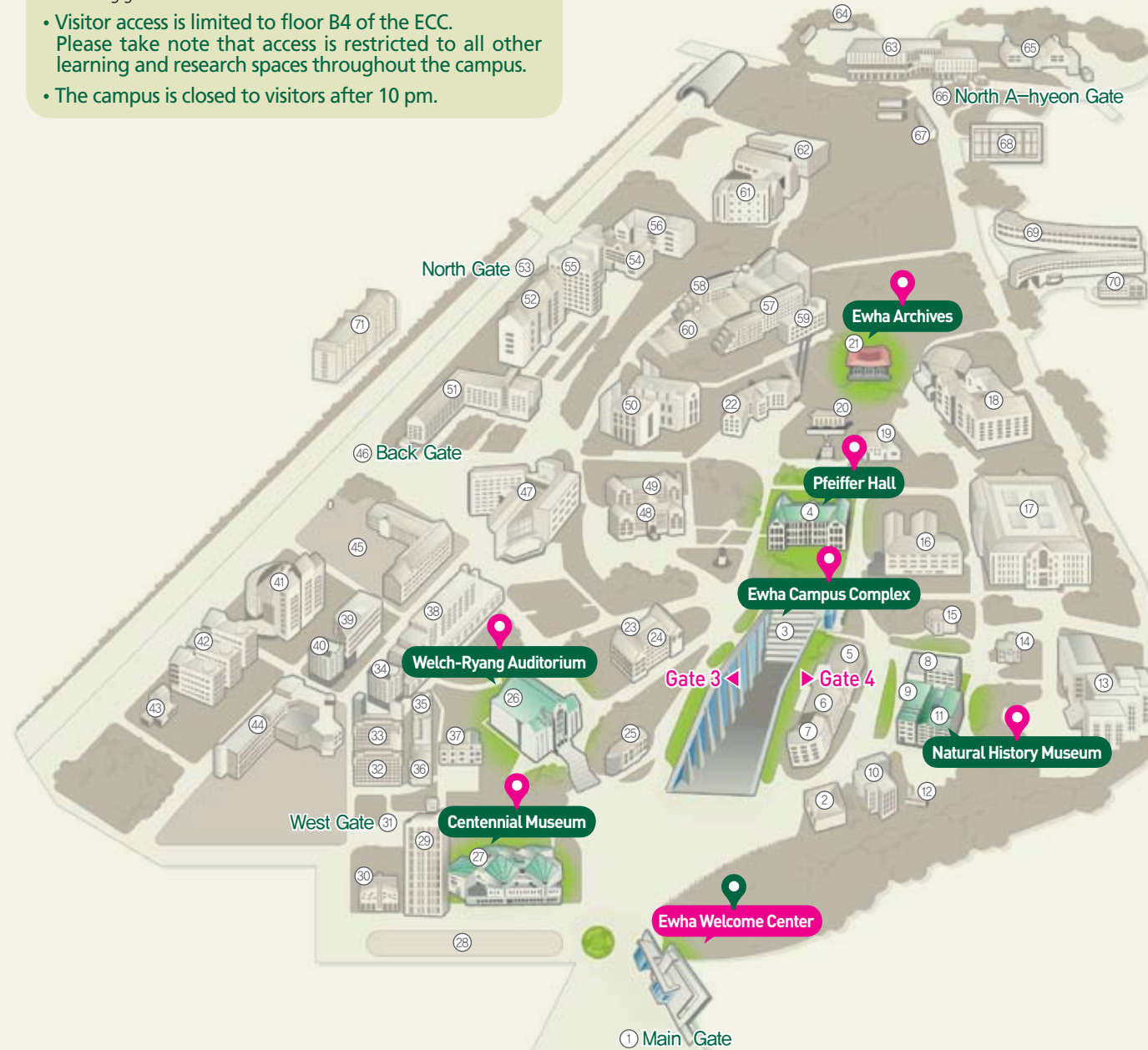


# Campus Map
